## Mallee Races To Victory

Sensational weather and fierce competition made for a fantastic day for the 2024 Manangatang P-12 College Athletics Carnival. Despite a strong challenge from Wattle, Mallee showed they were *faster, higher, stronger - together* in the Olympic year.

With Mallee starting just 2 points ahead after the 800m and 1500m events, it was all up for grabs in the sun.

The scoring was even throughout the day and there were some close battles for Age Champion. Frankie and Paddy in the 7/8 year old boys and Jordyn and Jayda in the 15/16 year old girls were split by just a point, and Markus and Cooper could not be separated in the 15-16 year old boys.

There were some great individual performances with multiple records being challenged and broken. Lily F broke the record for the 11/12 year old girls 1500m on Tuesday with a time of 6 minutes 35 seconds, eclipsing Marie Barry's record by 6 seconds. In the 7/8 year old boys, Paddy launched an incredible vortex throw of 23.97m, outdoing Kris Morris' record from 1999 by 64 cm. Paddy also broke Rory Plant's record of 5.81m for Triple Jump set in 2022., with a new record of 6.46m. Congratulations Paddy.

Mallee had great representation in the Primary age groups, scoring 433 points to Wattle's 351. Wattle just got the better in the Secondary age groups (237 to 229) but that was not enough to stop Mallee from winning the Athletics Carnival overall.

So after Wattle won the Swimming, Mallee took a liking to the land competitions to win both the Cross Country and Athletics, claiming bragging rights for 2024.

A lot of work goes into making the Athletics Carnival a thoroughly enjoyable event. Thank you to:

- The Growing Community class for their work providing food and refreshments
- Mr Goodwin for his data entry and announcing prowess
- Staff for helping run events and assisting students
- Parents and families for cheering on the students and helping in the running and packing up of events
- The students who gave it their all. It was great to see many students encouraging others, showing pride in their achievements, and recording personal bests. It is extremely rewarding to see a student set a goal, work towards it, then achieve it on the day.

The primary students will have the Tooleybuc Sports on Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup>. The Division stage is September 4<sup>th</sup> for Secondary students and September 16<sup>th</sup> for Primary students. More information will be shared on these events as they get closer.

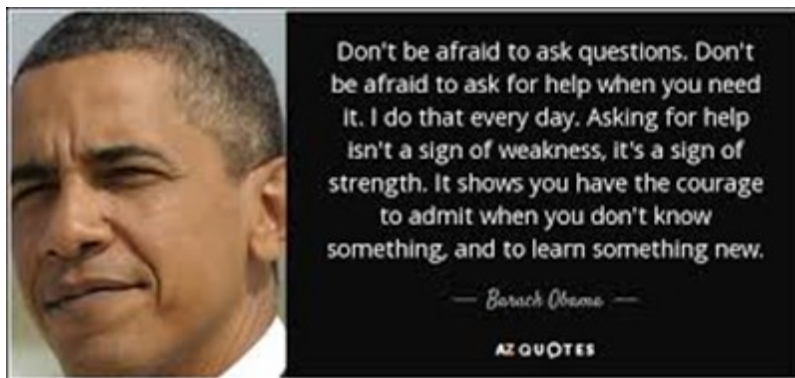
Microwavable soups are in the fridge for students to help themselves – **STUDENTS DO NEED TO BRING A SPOON.**

**IFS -Intergrated Family Services**– In the previous Linkup I shared what Orange Door was. You can self-refer to the Orange Door, Child Protection can refer you, or be referred by any other external organisation. I can also refer you. Orange Door completes the assessments required to determine where or what services would best support you. IFS is one of those pathways. Also known as Family services, which are either provided from Swan Hill or Robinvale depending on the needs. IFS supports families who may be struggling with parenting issues, managing behaviours of children, those tricky teenage years, communication issues, relationship issues in the family, risk taking behaviours, routines and the list just goes on. Orange door will speak to you about whatever your concern is and will advise of the best support system for you. What is also fantastic about IFS is they come to you, they work from a strength based perspective as they know you are the expert when it comes to your family and they use your expertise to support you. Raising children is one of the hardest jobs there is, it is not easy and we do not get given a handbook of what to do. There is nothing wrong with asking for help and sadly we tend to feel as though we are a failure or not as good as others. Everyone at some stage or another needs help, some of us lucky to have extended family on hand or amazing neighbours and friends that are like a village supporting us, unfortunately this is not the case for all of us, hence IFS.

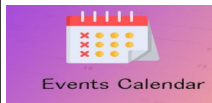

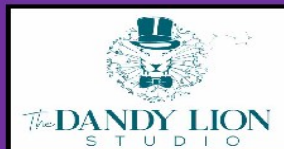
